Over the past four years, Wellspring Living has trained individuals and groups from more than 20 different cities in the United States on opening restoration homes for girls and women.

Through the Wellspring Living Institute, we hope to assist even more organizations through networking, training, and mentoring.

We desire to walk alongside your organization as you seek to serve girls or women coming out of abuse and into bright futures.

Wellspring Living offers mentorship for organizations that are interested in starting or building a program for women, a program for girls or both.

The Women's Program connects a caring community with women seeking a way out of unhealthy lifestyles. This residential program promotes healing, wholeness, independence, and family reunification by dealing with the serious issues participants face in a holistic way. We offer the opportunity for an individualized recovery plan through mentoring, counseling, coaching, life skills, education, family therapy and spiritual encouragement.

The Girl's Program provides a residential therapeutic and educational program for child victims of forced prostitution and sex trafficking. The Girl's Program includes services such as counseling, group therapy, education, life skills, vocational training, family reunification and spiritual care.

Mentorship Philosophy

Our number one priority is to provide philosophy, structure, relational help, and ongoing troubleshooting that will create a safe place for healing to begin in new recovery programs.

Mentorship Goals

- » Replicating best practices and program policy for services to survivors.
- » Increasing capacity for survivors through support of new development efforts.
- » Encouraging nonprofit management efficiency for organizations serving survivors.
- » Creating a network of like-minded service providers who think creatively about care for survivors.

Phases of Implementation

READINESS PHASE

The Readiness Phase includes a Self-Assessment and Independent Work Plan provided by Wellspring Living.
